SunWise Program

CES will host an evening lecture program to address the growing concern about sun exposure to children. The program is based on the



Environmental Protection Agency's national educational

initiative warning kids about skin cancer, eye damage and other dangers from overexposure to the sun.

The program will address both the risks involved from overexposure and demonstrate preventative strategies for dealing with this problem.

The program will be held on February 23, 2004 from 7:00 to 8:30 and is designed for parents and others concerned about the sun safety of children. Gift bags of sample products will be distributed to the first 100 people attending the evening program. This program is free of charge.

In addition to information from a SunWise representative, Dr. Sewa S. Legha, the Director of the Melanoma Center at St. Luke's Episcopal Hospital will discuss the realities of sun-related skin cancer.

EPA's SunWise School Program aims to enhance kindergarten through eighth grade children's understanding of ultraviolet (UV) radiation, stratospheric ozone depletion and health risks from overexposure to the sun. Although UV-related health risks affect people of all ages, the American Academy of Dermatology estimates that

people receive 80 percent of their lifetime exposure to the sun by the time they are 18 years old. This means that protecting young children from overexposure to the sun can have an enormous impact on lowering lifetime risk. UV overexposure causes cataracts and skin cancer.
