## **Fourth Grade**

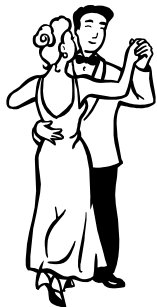

Some other details about the dance which might be helpful to you are:

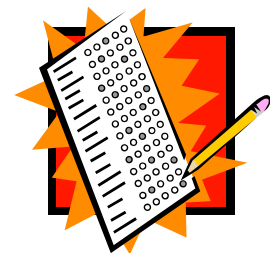
