The CES community is invited to make a difference in the lives of Richmond area youngsters by joining 2nd and 4th grade in their annual Toy Drive.

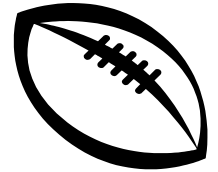
