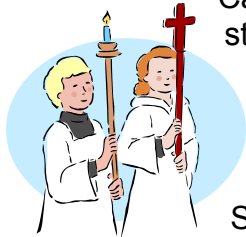
Enjoy Fort Bend County Parade and Fair

Ms. Jan Dennison, CES art teacher reports that all 188 CES elementary students worked very hard on their Fort Bend County Fair projects. Every student will exhibit a work of art at the fair September 29, 2006 (until pick up on Oct 9th). Twelve Middle School art projects are also included bringing the total art entries to 200. This is the largest number of art projects to go to the Fort Bend County Fair from Calvary Episcopal School!



Students learned new art techniques, about other cultures and the way that they differ artistically. First grade mastered a Japanese fish printing technique called Gyotaku and fifth grade created an animal in an Aboriginal style of art. The students used watercolor, tempera paint, oil pastel, pastel chalk and cut paper techniques to express their creativity.
